Michelle Pearson Culinary Specialist Recently the Lay Leadership team concluded months of prayer and discernment in order to present to an upcoming Called Charge Conference a new structure for church leadership at Jasper First Methodist Church. In addition to the inner circle of Stewards, we will be building additional circles of ministry participation with Steward leaders. A lay leadership committee will be nominated at the Charge Conference. Once a date is set, we will plan for a time of commissioning and celebration for those answering this call to serve.

### The Council of Stewards

The Council of Stewards will be composed of Stewards who hold both temporal and spiritual responsibility for the church. The Council will operate with the mandates of the SPRC, Trustees, Finance, and Administrative Board. The Council will meet monthly and make spirit led decisions. Stewards will serve 3-year terms beginning with a 1 year, 2 year or 3 year nomination. Stewards may create their own separate teams to help carry our the responsibilities of the Council. Stewards will be approved by the charge conference and will hold individual mantels of responsibility.

Part 4, Section VIII, paragraph 445.2 of the Book of Doctrines & Discipline states, "No staff member or immediate family member of a pastor or staff member may serve on the committee. Only one person from an immediate family residing in the same household shall serve on the committee."

Stewards will be expected to meet the following criteria: Be an active member of the church; Attend in person Sunday morning worship on a regular basis; Practice a habit of tithing; Be active in a small group or Bible study; Serve in some capacity each month.
